A View from County Hall



At County Hall we have shared the National and successive periods of one minute silence following recent tragedies. Unfortunately these ceremonies have served to remind us what strange and turbulent times we live in. Here on the Wolds its tempting to see ourselves within a safe bubble and think - "it's not our problem" but these are issues which we must address across the country.

I have had to do a fair amount of problem solving recently and generally a "problem" is a complex web of interwoven issues that all have to be unpicked before you can tackle the problem as a whole. At a Local Government meeting last week, I spoke about the complexities that arise when local authorities join with others to deliver services to gain economies of scale. In general, for a small district such as Ryedale I believe this has great merit until something goes wrong, and we are then left with the inevitable question of democratic accountability or any accountability for that matter. It's a long and intricate debate which is set to continue whilst ever North Yorkshire has a two tier government system.

I am hesitant to mention elections, but I must close by thanking all that turned out to vote on the 4th May. I will continue to ensure we have a strong voice at County Hall and as always offer you an open line of communication with me.

As the next meeting of Weaverthorpe Parish Council is on 17th July, we have contacted RDC and asked for an extension to that date to enable the application to be fully discussed at that meeting, and then a suitable reply can be formulated on behalf of the residents and the Council. That request has been granted and replies will now be accepted up to 21st July 2017, from the Council and individual residents.

Response to Cllr. Jainu-Deens

In Cllr. Jainu-Deen's article in the June Warbler, he speaks of a proposed mobile phone mast, and speaks with assumed authority that this is something his constituents want. Firstly, the proposal was also sent to the parish council and they stated that they would not be supporting such an application. Myself and Sylvia Collier have spoken to multiple residents within the village who strongly oppose a mobile phone mast being erected within the village. Secondly, the proposed siting of the mast would have it in close proximity to many homes. There is no evidence stating that there is absolutely zero risk to people's health with regards to mobile phone masts. Thirdly, many people are happy that there is limited mobile signal available in the village and is in point of fact something they relish about the village. And finally, now we have a better broadband service those who wish to utilise their mobile phones can do so via various handsets and apps. In short the feeling within the village from a number of residents is that a mast is not welcomed or required.
